EACH SUMMER The Salvation Army provides an exciting eight week Bible Day Camp program for children in grades K-6.

The mission of the New Albany Center of Hope Bible Day Camp is to provide a safe, caring and nurturing environment for children in grades K-6. The Day Camp provides opportunities for children that allow them to grow spiritually, mentally, physically and emotionally through an organized program based on asset building.

The camp runs Monday through Friday, 8:00 AM — 5:30 PM from June 8 through July 31, 2008. The cost is \$70.00 per week with discounts for two or more children and some financial assistance is available for those meeting eligibility requirements. Activities include Bible, Arts and Crafts, Music, Drama, Computers, Recreation, Indoor and Outdoor Sports, Swimming and weekly Field Trips
